LOW FREQUENCY NOISE FROM PUBS AND CLUBS

Assessment of development proposals for the provision of entertainment at Hotels, Clubs and Open Air Concerts is often contentious and frequently the subject of strong community objection.

Changes in planning legislation to remove the requirement for a Place Of Public Entertainment (POPE) License and the desire of the Liquor Administration Board to progressively transfer control will place a greater load on local Council, which has the potential to create difficulties for Council officers who are not expert in the assessment of noise. In particular we foresee difficulties associated with measurement and prediction of LF noise and management of issues associated with after midnight audibility and late night noise disturbance complaints. There are also problems with LF noise from industry as well but often without a beat frequency.

The presentation describes as a case study work done in conjunction with Newcastle City Council to develop a set of preliminary development assessment and compliance guidelines for LF noise impacts from music and puts forward, for discussion, a method to assist Council officers and noise professionals when dealing with this issue.
