4. Acoustics Australia

Thanks you ladies for continuing to put out a fantastic journal. As you may have noticed the journal has become an e-version ONLY journal. This move has saved the Society a significant amount of money in printing and postage.

Acoustics Australia continues to request articles and technical notes to be submitted by the membership for inclusion in the journal. If members have worked on an interesting project, please consider writing it up for publication as a technical note. The projects you work on may appear routine to you, but to others working in different areas they could be very interesting! In addition, the presenters of the technical talks are encouraged to write up their presentation as a technical note for publication in the journal.

5. Awards and Grants

In 2014, the NSW Division awarded the AAS NSW Early Career Researchers (ECRs) and Research Student Travel Award to 7 students to attend the Internoise 2015 in Melbourne. The amount of each award and the recipient are shown in the Award Summary Table below. The award is to be spent on conference registration fees, travel to and from the conference venue, and accommodation. The successful awardees will provide a short report (200 to 500 words) on their experiences at the Conference for the December 2014 issue of the Acoustics Australia journal.

The NSW Division of the AAS is into the second year of a newly introduced travel award this year for existing AAS NSW Division members to attend the annual Conference of the Australian Acoustical Society. The award is open to all current AAS NSW Division members who have held membership for 12 months or more. The amount of the award is up to \$1000 and is to be spent towards the conference registration fee, travel to and from the conference venue, and accommodation. Successful awardees will be required to provide a short report (up to 300 words) on their experiences at the Conference for the

December 2014 issue of the Acoustics Australia journal. The purpose of this award was to encourage those who would like to present a paper at the conference but find it difficult to obtain employer support.

Each award consists of a cash prize of \$250 and one year's subscription to the Australian Acoustical Society. The objectives of this education prize are to encourage undergraduate students into the field of acoustics and provide exposure for the Society at the university prize giving ceremonies.
