



Westport Taskforce Workshop

Members of the Westport Taskforce will be presenting the 5 shortlisted options for the State's port strategy with a focus on the challenges with road and rail routes for all options. The newly implemented State Planning Policy 5.4 (2019) - *Road and Rail Noise* has a direct impact on meeting such challenges. Further presentations will be provided by members of the acoustic community looking at various aspects that the new SPP 5.4 places on these options. Marine noise impacts from port activity will also be discussed. There will be an opportunity to provide feedback to the Westport Taskforce on foreseen constraints for them to consider in the preparation of the final report.
